\* Student Sexual Misconduct Policy, Section 4.0: If the student requests confidentiality or asks that the complaint not be pursued, the College will take all reasonable steps to investigate and respond to the complaint consistent with the request for confidentiality or request not to pursue an investigation. The College, however, reserves the right to investigate the report and take appropriate

action. The College is likely to make a decision to pursue such a matter if it determines in the exercise of its discretion that 1. The allegations, if true, give reason to believe that the student or other members of the college community may be at continued risk and/or the College may be put at risk of legal liability and 2. The report is credible.

For example, if a student reports to the Office of the Dean of Students that s/he was sexually assaulted after a party, and requests that her identity remain anonymous while the Dean formally investigates the matter, the Dean will take all reasonable steps to both investigate the matter and honor the student's request. In order to do this, the Dean may call in any witnesses who were present at the party and ask general questions about the alleged respondent- how they appeared and if the witness noticed anything particular about that night. The reporting complainant must be aware, however, that this method of investigation may limit the information the Dean may be able to gather.

\*\* A College official will ask the student how he or she wishes to proceed: by formal resolution or by informal resolution (examples for informal- facilitated discussion, mediation, etc.). An informal resolution is not possible when the college has reason to believe a sexual assault or any other form of violence has taken place.
